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HISTORY UM

- **1954** The College of Teacher Education (PTPG) Malang was established on September 1, 1954, by the Decree of the Minister of Education and Education of the Republic of Indonesia No. 33756/Kb of August 4, 1954, which was opened and officialised on October 18, 1954.
- **1957** Established on November 20, 1957, the Faculty of Education and Education Sciences (FKIP) Malang at the University of Airlangga Surabaya was formed by Decree No. 119533/S issued by the Minister of Education for Education and Youth of the Republic of Indonesia.
- **1963** As of May 1, 1963, it became the Institute of Higher Education and Science (IKIP) by the Decree of the Minister of Colleges and Sciences No. 55 Year 1963 on May 22, 1963.
- **1999** Universitas Negeri Malang (UM) was founded on August 4, 1999, under Presidential Decree No. 93 of 1999.
- **2012** UM founded the Faculty of Psychological Education (FPPsi).

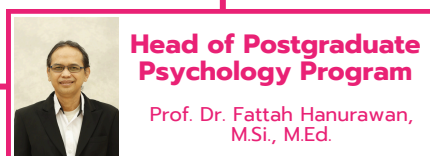
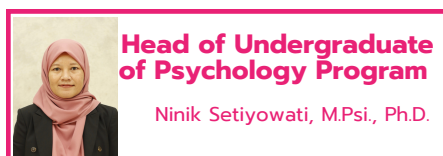

Program Overview: 2.5+1 Joint Degree

In this prestigious Joint Degree Program with Management & Science University (MSU), students have the opportunity to spend 2.5 years at the Faculty of Psychology at Universitas Negeri Malang (UM), followed by 1 year at MSU in Malaysia. This program is designed to provide students with a well-rounded academic experience, combining the best of both institutions and cultures.

Tuition Fee at MSU:

The tuition fee for the 1-year period at MSU is 22,500 MYR.

By the end of the program, students will earn dual degrees, enriching their educational and professional credentials with international recognition and opening doors to global career opportunities.

2. International Exposure

Enhance your global experience through various International Credit Transfer (ICT) programs, where you can spend 1 semester at one of our esteemed partner universities worldwide, earning international credits and broadening your academic and cultural horizons. Additionally, you can engage in international seminars, contribute to international service communities, and gain valuable experience through international internships. These opportunities are designed to enrich your academic journey, strengthen your global network, and equip you with the skills necessary to succeed in an interconnected world.

- Local Students: Complete a three-year program at Universitas Negeri Malang (UM). They can participate in a one-year international exchange program through our partnerships with International Credit Transfer (ICT) Scheme and International Community Services.
- International Students: Complete a three-year Universitas Negeri Malang (UM) program. They can choose to pursue international credit during their studies in Indonesia or abroad.

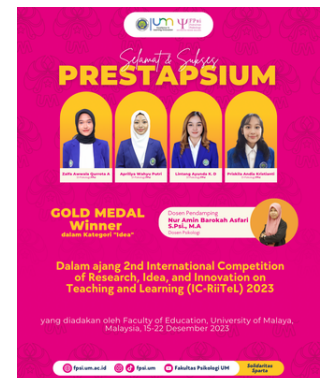
